Highlights from Farnell



The hive of activity across Farnell reflects the vibrancy and energy of the community, not our size or average age! Over the last 12 months, we've held several community engagement events and fundraisers to build the profile of the Church, and we've gone from strength to strength with new residents and visiting attendees at our Sunday services. Numbers swelled, as they do, for the Harvest, Remembrance, Christmas and Easter Services – Christmas in particular found us packed to the eaves as revellers from the Farnell Festivities (community Christmas party) trooped down after being fortified by mince pies and mulled wine.

Following the annual Summer Fete in July, we've had a talk from the Duke of Fife about the history of the Carnegies and Kinnaird Estate, a Treasure Hunt, the annual Coffee Evening & Plant Sale and a musical evening with the Prosecco Singers and South Esk Strings. Union events have also been held in the Farnell SWI Hall, including the party to celebrate the Union and Adriaan's First Anniversary, a concert by Bruce Davies and a Soup & Sweet Saturday. The Church has also been hired out as a venue for talks organised by members of the community and by Friends of Farnell, all bringing visitors across the threshold.

A huge thanks must go to the members of the congregation and wider community for volunteering time and skills to bring us all together.



Highlights from (Brechin) Gardner Memorial

We continue our mission to reach out into the community.

Adriaan is involved with the two primary schools even attending their adventure weekend at Dalquise outdoor centre. Their end-of-term services are now held in the

church. It is great to see so many young people participating in the service through music, stories and games. We had the Easter trail for the Maisondieu pupils who looked for the Easter story clues throughout the church.

Every Thursday during the winter months the Night Light service between 7 pm to 9 pm has been held in the church.

Members of the congregation donated food items at Harvest Thanksgiving for the Jars community hub. Several members of the pastoral group helped to pack food parcels, which was used to help struggling families in the town. We welcomed in February the local Scout and Guide groups to celebrate the Founder's/Thinking Day service.

Our Hospitality team has been very busy this past year providing catering at numerous events, e.g. VE Day Café celebrations, The Big Lunch, monthly Coffee and Blethers, and soup & sweet lunches.

The Worship team are working closely with Adriaan to provide services within local care homes and sheltered housing. Adriaan has started a Bible Fellowship Group during this year.

We removed the pews from under the balcony area in August to provide a play area for the very young. We were delighted to get pew cushions from The Glens & Kirriemuir United Parish Church. We are planning to do a major redesign of the back of the garden.

We have welcomed an increase in attendance in person and YouTube at our weekly services as well as at our joint summer services, Remembrance, Christmas services and Easter services.

Thank you to all our groups and the congregation for all their hard work and support. A special thanks to Adriaan, Sanelle, Albert and Lukas for being part of this Church family.

Worship Group

Worship has a major role to play in the life of the church, and it was decided to approach the Care Homes and Sheltered Housing to offer services for the residents and staff. We started our first service in November 2024 and we have led worship in St Drostans, Bearehill, The Glade and Southport at Christmas, Easter with monthly services at The Glade. We have also visited the Dalhousie Centre this year.

We realise how much the residents and staff have missed the opportunity of being part of worship since the COVID-19 pandemic. It has been a joy to watch the residents start to tap their feet in time with the music and join in with the hymns. Friendships have been renewed and formed, and it is good to chat to the residents and staff over a cuppa after the services.

The themes of the services have ranged from remembrance, spring and creation. There is a mixture of poetry, readings as well as hymns from CH4, as well as Songs of God's People in the 30-minute service. We are planning to have a wee break from the care homes during July and August, but will be supporting our Minister by leading worship on 20th July at Farnell and 27th July at Gardner.

Brechin and Farnell members make up the Worship group. we would like to do more services in the homes, but need more helpers, so if you are interested in worship and would like to join us, please contact the Church Office.

GARDNER STEEL PAN BAND
